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NOTES TO PARTICIPANTS & AUDIENCE:

1. All festival venues are scent-free in respect to those with allergies and sensitivities - please do not wear perfumes or colognes.
2. Participants, Teachers and Accompanists are asked to observe Canadian copyright Laws - use of unauthorized material may lead to disqualification.
3. Please remain seated or wait outside the performance areas during performances and adjudications.
4. Please refrain from conversation during performances and adjudication times.
5. Competitors, please notify the secretary's desk before the competition if unable to perform.
6. A solo participant must enter two classes per discipline to be eligible for an award.
7. The choice of scholarship winners is the sole responsibility of the adjudicators.
8. A cross section of performers will be selected by the adjudicators and the committee to perform at the final concert.
9. The festival president and executive members constitute a protest committee should need arise. All protests must be submitted in writing to a committee member and in no case is the adjudicator to be approached.

PIANO/FLUTE



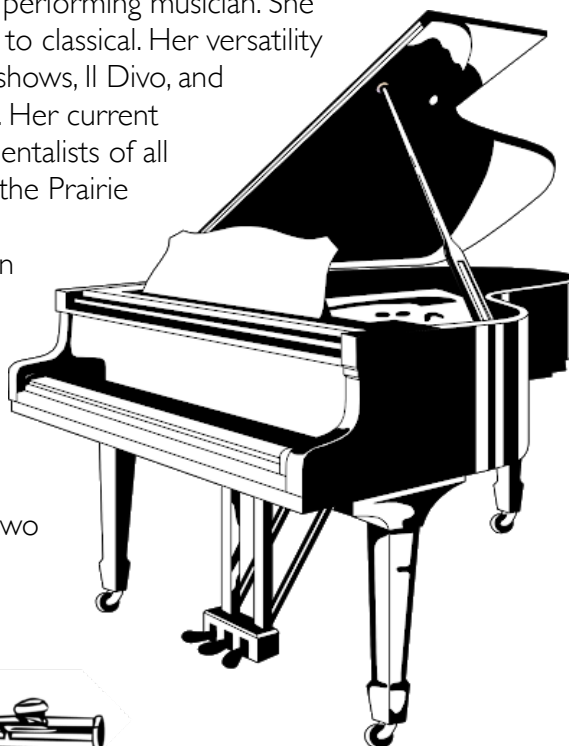
Jenn Voth is a prairie girl stemming from Brandon, MB. She started her musical journey at a young age at the piano under the watchful eye of her grandma who supervised every practice with great accuracy! Her love of music continued to grow and lead her to a teaching career which began as a teen. Growing up she was active in the school band, sang and played for choirs, and led church music.

She pursued a Diploma in Music from Prairie Bible College, a Bachelor of Music through Brandon University with concert pianist Alexander Tselyakov and a Masters in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from Memorial University of Newfoundland. While in Newfoundland she was exposed to the Taubman Technique and Body Mapping. These methods

changed her approach to the piano and gave her a greater appreciation of the body and the instrument.

Throughout the years, she has been active as a freelance performing musician. She plays and appreciates all styles of music from jazz, to pop to classical. Her versatility has lead her to accompany choirs, play for musicals, pop shows, Il Divo, and premiere a piano trio by local composer Laura Pettigrew. Her current collaboration work involves coaching a variety of instrumentalists of all levels for festival and at the university level. She plays for the Prairie Cello Institute, is a utility player for the RSO, and recently collaborated with the Prairie Saxophone Initiative. Now in Regina, she has a full studio of private piano and theory students, is an RCM certified teacher and is a member of the Saskatchewan Registered Music Teacher Association.

When she has a few moments of spare time, she enjoys gardening, camping, reading, and spending time with her two kids.

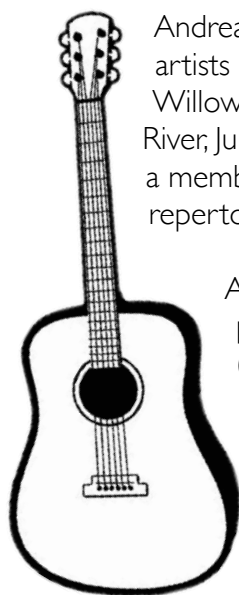

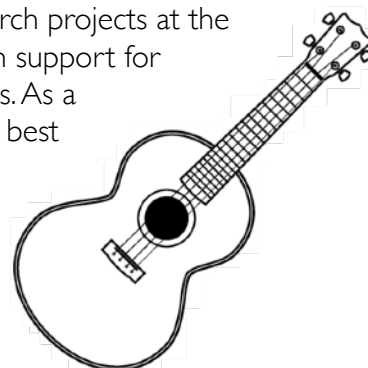
